STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY 2017-18

It was evident from the survey conducted among the students that about 78% of the students are satisfied with the syllabus covered, teacher preparation and teachers' ability to communicate. Remaining 22% provided certain suggestions for improvement. Majority i.e about 90% point out that teachers approach to teaching can best be described as very good whereas 10% suggested that multimedia or other innovative approaches can also be adopted along with other common strategies. According to them most of the teachers illustrates with examples and applications whereas others use illustrations rarely. About 75 percentage of the students mentioned that teachers adopt student centred method like participatory learning and issue based learning for enriching the learning experiences. 90% of the students opined that about ninety percentage of the teachers used ICT tools for transacting curriculum.

Majority of the students pointed about that internal evaluation process in the institution is a fair process as it is transparent and robust. They ensured that the system of internal assessment is communicated with them well in time and that the performance in the assignments, practical works and projects was discussed with them. 100% of the students opined that the institute takes active interest in promoting the teacher training for internship and field visit but very few opportunities are provided for student exchange. So they suggested to incorporate more student exchange programs with other educational institutions. Students suggested that teaching and mentoring process in the institution facilitated their cognitive, social and emotional growth significantly as the institution is providing multiple opportunities to learn and grow. 98% of the students pointed out that the teachers of the institution inform about the expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes at the initial stage itself during the orientation programme. The teachers revise these outcomes at the beginning of each semester. 70 percentage of the students mentioned that their mentors do a necessary follow up after assigning a task, whereas remaining 30% are not satisfied with the mentoring process. About 78% of the students point out that majority of the teachers are able to identify the strengths and weaknesses and assisted them for achieving their goals and be more confident and successful. Majority of the students agreed that the institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of teaching learning process, as the institution runs a teacher education programme that gives equal weightage to curricular and cocurricular activities. 100% of the students strongly agreed that all the teachers encouraged them to participate in extra -curricular activities. They also mentioned that moderate efforts are made by the institute to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills through workshops and placement cell programs. 75% of the student teachers are of the opinion that overall quality of the teaching learning process of the institution is very good.
